



Rothbury Climate and Nature groups are coming out of hibernation as Spring arrives!

Many of us planted acorns and hazelnut seeds to grow for the *Seeds2Trees Living Woods* project. About 20 of us have these seeds germinating in our gardens, ready to give back to the project in a year or so. We are about to plant willow and alder seeds.

ROWANS (Restoring Our Wild and Natural Spaces) continue with their work planting trees and hedges, wildflowers, and bulbs. The Spar in Thropton is very kindly supporting them by providing staff volunteers for one of their projects. Spar staff will be removing hedge protectors, clearing weeds, trimming willow, marking out a path, creating willow and hazel structures alongside ROWAN members. Chris Cann tells me, 'This is just the start! We have lots of exciting planting plans in the year ahead'. Spar volunteers are helping Rothbury Rubbish Friends also, they take part in the community litter picks, and do litter pick around their shop.

#### About us

The Coquetdale League of Friends, a local registered charity, has been run for the last 46 years by volunteers. Our aim is to support health providers and those who rely on their services in the Coquet Valley. We do this by raising funds and managing donations so that we can help our health care providers give their patients the best health services in this very rural area.

#### History

Founded in 1978, the League raised funds to provide equipment for the Old Rothbury Hospital, the GP surgery and the District Nursing team. The League continued to support the Hospital when it moved into the new building across the river, purchased items for the new hospital ward.

During the closure of our hospital the League continued to fund vital health related services in the community – support for patient transport, bereavement counselling and the Community Nursing Team. We also supported the Save the Rothbury Hospital Campaign and are delighted that NHS funded beds have been restored with the addition of much needed care home accommodation.

#### **Current activities**

Last year we donated two smart TV's to Rothbury Cottage Care especially for use by NHS patients and those on respite care who would otherwise not have a TV in their room. We contributed towards a defibrillator at Rye Hill and set up a grant to meet the top up fees for anyone using the new Care Home for respite care who was eligible for NCC support.

#### Update on EES / ETIAS and Travelling to EU in 2024:

This is a much delayed scheme and is now scheduled to be operational from early October 2024 for EES and mid 2025 for ETIAS. Citizens from the UK will be required to complete an ETIAS application prior to boarding an aircraft, sea carrier, or coach vehicle for Europe, and this includes travellers who will only be transiting in Europe en route to other destinations. British citizens can expect their ETIAS application to normally be processed and approved within minutes, and the authorisation is sent by email in the form of a PDF document. There is no need to print or present any documents as the ETIAS is stored electronically against the passport details.

#### NEW: Travelling to Europe? Don't get caught out by the 10 year rule

UK travellers used to be able to carry up to nine months left on an old passport over to a new one.

This meant that a passport could be valid for more than 10 years.

This did not matter when the UK was a member of the European Union (EU).

But the rules changed after Brexit, and the majority of EU countries no longer accept British passports which were issued more than 10 years before the date of travel.

This is known as the "10-year rule".

To enter those countries now, your UK passport must:

- have been issued less than 10 years before the date you enter the EU country (i.e. the "date of issue")
- be valid for at least three months after the day you plan to leave (i.e. the "date of expiry")

If your passport does not meet these requirements, you will be refused entry.

#### **Updated:** Landlines are changing

Further to our article in last month's newsletter, many of you will have recently received leaflets from Northumberland County Council in with your latest Council Tax bill detailing many options that need to be considered during the proposed digital phone switchover. It is worth a read and don't forget to contact your telecom provider such as BT if you feel there are problems for you eg no mobile signal, no internet, issues in power cuts, use telecare device etc.

As a reminder.....the old copper landline services are changing. You can still have a landline in your home but the technology that powers it will be different. You should be able to keep your old landline number. Most existing (digital) handsets should work, but if they don't your provider can advise. You shouldn't face any extra costs for the service itself.

However, aspects to note:

- a) It won't work if there is a power cut as they need electricity to function. They are relying on you having a mobile phone <u>and</u> signal as back up in such circumstances.
- b) There is a possibilty of the providers offering a "resilience solution" of a free battery pack for the landline connection in these power failure situations for certain individuals....however as our area can have power outages for days at a time there is some concern as to actually how resilient this offer is in reality. They are currently offering up to an hour of back up.
- c) These new digital landlines use your internet connection to make and receive calls. So, they are relying on you having a (reliable) internet connection at home. However, your phone network provider is able to provide you with a connection to support this new system at NO EXTRA COST to yourself if you don't already have an internet router.
- d) So if you are concerned by any of the above, fall into any of the categories below or don't wish to be changed over automatically then PLEASE INFORM YOUR PROVIDER THAT YOU WISH TO RETAIN YOUR CURRENT COPPER LANDLINE. The BT contact number is 0330 1234 150:
- Are 75 and over.
- Consider yourself to have some additional needs eg medical need, possibly isolated, single and feel vulnerable, medical issue that needs access to 999 quickly etc.
- Only have a landline and no broadband.
- Need of (or possibly will need in near future) a telecare personal safety alarm (ie those alarms worn around the neck and wrist in case of falls or personal emergency). Telecare systems do work with digital landlines BUT a power cut or internet drop out can cause them to fail.
- People with no mobile signal at home.
- People with no mobile phone at home.

Please can everyone make sure their more vulnerable neighbours are aware that they don't have to do this and a simple phone call to the provider to stop this is all that is needed at present. Why not help them make that call if it helps to alleviate worry and anxiety? Thank you.

NCC defines "an actionable defect" as a pothole of at least 40mm (1.5 inches) deep and a minimum of 300mm (1 foot) in diameter. However, we think that

if you aren't happy, then report it!

  line.
- Turn off electrical appliances at the socket (this is particularly important for heating or cooking appliances as your power could be restored at any time and potentially cause a safety hazard).
- Keep one light switched on so you know when power is restored.
- Keep a battery-operated or wind-up torch handy they're much safer than candles.
- Check on your elderly or sick neighbours and relatives.
- Ensure you have warm clothing and blankets handy and some food and drink in your home that does not require
  electricity to heat or prepare it.
- Call 999 in the event of a medical emergency.

If you have additional needs due to your medical or personal circumstances, and are not part of our Priority Services Membership, you should consider joining for **free** by visiting <u>Priority Services Membership</u> or <u>calling 0800 169</u>

2996. This will help us to support you during a power cut. This will include regular updates on the situation and consideration of any need for provision of hot food and alternative accommodation.

#### In the Event of Electricity Failure

The Emergency Hub at the Star Inn will come into operation in the event of a long power outage, especially if there is no indication when power will be restored.

A varied response will be needed according to the emergency, but as a general rule:

Loss of power overnight: Emergency hub will open up in the morning and remain open as long as needed.

**Loss of power during the day:** Emergency hub will open late afternoon/early evening to provide hot food, drinks and hot water.

A sign will be placed outside the Star to indicate that the Hub is open and we will endeavour to spread information by word of mouth or telephone if they are working.
